FREE NEGRO STEALERS.

ON the 29th In ftant, about Mid' Night, four Men came to the Houfe of VALENTINE LOCUST, an aged Free Negro, who refides on Leek Creek, in Wake County, and calling at the Door to gain Ad-Mittance, as foon as the Door was opened, Two of them entered with Clubs, and in ftan-Taneoufly knocked down the old Man and his Wife, and beat them to fuch a Degree as fcarcely to leave Life; and whilft they were in that Situation, the Robbers carried off two of their Children, a Boy named Abfalom, aged about twelve Years, of a yellowifh Complexion, who is juft able to read and write; a Girl, named Polly, age about five Years, of a Complexion more yellow than her Brother.

The Father of the fe Children is a refpectable and induftrious old Man, who has hitherto made ample Provifions for him felf and Family; and it is hoped, from the peculiar Circumstances of his Cafe, arifing from his Incapacity to bear Witnefs, except againft his own Colour, added to the diftreffed Situation he muft be placed in after the Lofs of his two Children, will awaken the Feelings of the Humane, and that they will contribute every Thing in their Power they may tend to the detecting and punifhing fuch vile Offenders.

It is fuppofed the Perpetrators of this Offence, will endeavor to convey their Prey to the State of Georgia, in the Character of Slaves, for the Purpofe of Traffic.
